Aimed to finalize a global legally binding treaty on plastic pollution.

Session ended without agreement on a consolidated text.

Outcome

No consensus reached on the treaty text.

Two alternative drafts introduced—criticized for weak obligations.

Negotiations will continue; no date set for the next INC.

Deep divisions over binding vs. voluntary measures and scope of coverage.
