How do we provide a sustainable supply for routine immunization and emergencies? How do we instill and maintain confidence in vaccines and their benefits to society?

This year's course will be held at three sites simultaneously connected through live broadcast, combining lectures, Q&A, group case studies, and other interactive activities. 
